I speak to students about how they are the lucky ones, lucky because Canterbury Vale School chose them out of a pool of students all needing some specialised help and that with limited spaces they are so fortunate to have an intervention to assist them not only with their behaviour but their learning. My favourite student is Sabiana because she's cute.



CVS Gets Innovative Furniture

Throughout this term the school has began to transfer two of our learning spaces into highly engaging and innovative learning areas. The first room to undergo a transformation was our library space. As resources on paper become more and more scarce, many schools including ours are moving away from shelves filled with unread books to using library spaces to create engaging and flexible learning areas. In line with this trend we re-painted ours some fun new colours and purchased collaborative seating as well as whiteboard topped tables to encourage engagement with STEM lessons. All of this furniture is on wheels and can be moved aside at a moments notice to create space for either our green screen filming kit or our Virtual Reality computers.

The refurbishment of the library has also included a new dedicated space for our school psychologist so that students are now able to be more comfortable when engaging with this service.

The second space we transformed was classroom 5. This was done as a trial to see what our classrooms could look like, with student input into the layout and purchase of furniture. This room also includes a whiteboard topped table for collaborative work, and after seeing how effective it has been we are now moving to include one of these in every classroom in the school.

This term in stem the teachers have decided to make soap. In are groups we had to research how to make soap we were all successful in finding a good enough recipe for soap.
















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
